Additionally, you must sign the return and write "filing as surviving spouse" or "filing as legal representative" by your signature.

Complete the form below only if the return results in a refund, and mail with the deceased's income tax return for the year. You must also submit a copy of the death certificate with this form.

Claim for refund cannot be processed if this information is not complete. Death certificate must accompany this completed form.
